## LUKOIL KEEPS INVESTING INTO YUGRA SOCIAL SPHERE

Vagit Alekperov, President of PJSC LUKOIL, and Natalya Komarova, Governor of the Khanty-Mansi Autonomous District – Yugra, signed an additional agreement for 2022. The signing took place today in the city of Kogalym (Yugra region) in presence of Valentina Matvienko, Speaker of the Federation Council of the Federal Assembly of the Russian Federation, and Vladimir Yakushev, Presidential Plenipotentiary Envoy to the Ural Federal District.

The document provides for further support of the region's social sphere. Among other things, the Company will continue construction and reconstruction of public amenities and utilities in Kogalym, outfitting a ski track in Langepas, beautification of public areas and yards in Urai, and creating an active leisure zone with a ski resort in Pokachi.

The Company also plans to repair a sports school stadium in Mezdurechensky settlement, to outfit yards in Kondinsky municipality, to build sports complexes in Nizhnevartovsky and Surgutsky municipalities. LUKOIL will also aid the Charity Fund for Indigenous Peoples of the North, Siberia and Russian Far East and continue to organize LUKOIL's Social and Culture Projects Contest. In total, social investments in the region will amount to about 1.5 billion roubles.
